The DCFS Scholarship Program provides a maximum of 48 scholarships each year; four of which are awarded to children of veterans. Youth who the Department has court-ordered legal responsibility for, youth who aged out of the Department's care at age 18 or older, youth that the Department had legal responsibility for prior to the youth's adoption being finalized, or youth that are in the Subsidized Guardianship or KinGap Program are eligible to apply for a DCFS Scholarship. Scholarship recipients receive up to four consecutive years of tuition and academic fee waivers to be used at participating Illinois state community colleges and universities, a monthly stipend and a medical card. Youth that graduated from high school in previous years or youth that are currently enrolled in college are eligible to apply for the Department scholarship.

USDA/1890 NATIONAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM - APPLICATION DEADLINE IS FEBRUARY 28, 2014

Through the **USDA/1890 National Scholars Program**, qualified students who are U.S. citizens may be awarded **full tuition** throughout their course of study if they attend one of the eighteen 1890 Historically Black Land-Grant Institutions and pursue a bachelor's degree in any field of study in agriculture, food, natural resource sciences or other related disciplines.

To be eligible for the USDA/1890 National Scholars Program scholarship, a student must:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better (on a 4.0 scale)
- Have been accepted for admission or currently attending one of the eighteen 1890 Historically Black Land-Grant Universities.
- Intend to study agriculture, food, natural resource sciences, or other related academic disciplines
- Demonstrate leadership and community service
- Submit an official transcript with the school seal and an authorized official's signature
- Submit a signed application (original signature only)

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR THE EDUCATION OF HOMELESS CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Scholarship funds are available to students who are **homeless or who have been homeless during their school attendance**. (Children being raised by relatives, who do NOT have legal guardianship or custody are considered homeless.) **Criteria:** Students who have not reached their 21st birthday by Sept. 1, 2012 and who have completed no more than one year of college may apply. Applicants may be high school seniors, students enrolled in GED or other alternative education programs, or recent graduates/GED recipients.
